

2017 Ohio State Fair



Remember that at the Fair an exhibitor may enter two items in each class. So if you are undecided about your entry, bring both!

The Ohio Gourd Society has its roots in the State Fair, and has been involved for years. In addition to encouraging entries, OGS is a sponsor of the gourd competition and is involved in the "Featured Artist Demonstrations Program." Several times during the Fair, OGS will provide artists to demonstrate gourd art techniques for visitors. Generally, the demonstration sessions last for about six hours and may involve up to four people. If you are interested in helping with the demonstration program, John Martin (martin.jf.kl@frontier.com) is working on the schedule.

That's Right! It is not too early to plan for entries at the Ohio State Fair. This year, the Fair runs from July 26 thru August 6. The information about entries is carried on the Ohio State website Fair at: ww.ohiostatefair.com Cardinal Hall was a fantastic venue for



the arts and crafts entries, and everyone involved in 2016 is hopeful for an even bigger display in 2017. The general classes for Gourd Art (Division 4201) are: 1. Painted/Colored, 2. Carved/Wood Burned, 3. Decorated (any technique), 4. Doll/Animal/Character, 5. Jewelry, 6. Musical Instrument, and 7. Holiday Theme. Please be sure to check the Fair's website to see the exact class descriptions. Entries for the Ohio State Fair are always due on June 20.

He busted his Maranka and a big Zucca too. He came a holding a gourd from Peru.

He started to coughin' and spittin' out seed. He had swallowed a luffa, and dishrag indeed.

I picked up a dipper and gave him a sip of ole creek water to give him some zip.

He asked about his dumbbell. I said, "I'm standin' right here," and jumped into the flivver and slammed 'er in gear.

We headed 'er northward on Interstate Ten a hopin' and prayin' the spark plugs would fire now and then.

> We limped into Delaware in time for the show. My husband was so happy He cut a lively dido.

HELPFUL HINTS FOR GROWING GOURDS!

Gourds need soil temperature of 75 degrees or more. They grow best in hot weather with full sun and plenty of water.

You can get a head start on the season by sprouting seed indoors. Put a layer of Pro-Mix in a tray, cover with plastic wrap and keep warm. Plants sprout in a cold frame or hot bed filled with Pro-Mix. Dust with powdered Sevin as soon as the first two leaves appear. Cucumber beetles will devour leaflets in a couple hours. Also watch for field mice. They love to eat gourd seeds. Transplant into rows about May 15th.

Prepare ground by tilling 13-13-13 into the soil. We use a Troybilt trencher to make a raised row with a trench for watering. Sprinkle Diazinon Granules in soil when transplanting to prevent Root Worm Bores. Without this precaution bores can kill the vines and it will be too late to replant. Use straw or newspaper for weed control.

Don't till with a power tiller after the first week. Gourds have feeder roots near the surface. If they are cut the fruit will never reach it's full potential.

The first flowers will all be male blossoms and are only on the main stem. The female flowers are only on the lateral branches. Increase your laterals and you will have more fruit.

As soon as the main vine reaches 10 feet, cut off the end. Now the vine will produce more laterals. As soon as these have 4 leaves, cut the end off them. This produces sub-laterals which you allow to grow as long as they can.

Gourds are ready to harvest when the first tendril on the vine, next to the stem, is dead or brown. If you are saving seeds don't allow gourds to freeze. Otherwise you can leave them outside.

By growing gourds you will come to know the joy in gardening.
