

### Society Related News A Big BIG Bold Goal!

A proposal to create a Strategic Planning Committee to increase the Show attendance was approved during the fall meeting held on November 7th.

The **big BIG BOLD GOAL** is to increase daily attendance at the annual Gourd Show to 10,000 per day by 2025!!!

The rationale is that increasing Show attendance will attract more Gourd Artists, Instructors and Vendors, which will increase Member Excitement and Enthusiasm, attract New Members and Volunteers, and Grow the OGS and Gourd awareness and education!

A 5 member committee consisting of 3 board members and 2 non-board members have outlined a strategy which will be finalized and presented to the board by the Spring meeting in April.

Our focus is on attracting new attendees and keeping them coming back—year after year. No idea is too big, but of course, we will also need the resources to make it happen!

### **Nominations for Open Positions** on the OGS Executive Board



### Is the OGS going WACKY!!?

In a collaboration with the Arts Council of Westerville, the OGS provided gourds with instructions for painting a snowy owl and happy penguin (compliments of Linda Rose), along with an informational sheet about gourds, to be included as part of the Westerville Arts Council for Kids and Youth (WACKY) craft-at-home program.

The Arts Council of Westerville is a non-profit organization with the mission to encourage participation in and appreciation of the arts in the Westerville, Ohio area. Signature events and activities include: April is Arts Month proclamation presented to ACW by City Council and featuring school district art shows and ACW receptions, Celebrate the Arts Writing Contest honoring and encouraging writers since 2006, and annual awarding of Arts Education Grants to teachers; Arts Alley booths for artists and families during summer months at Uptown Westerville 4th Fridays; annual community concert band and fine arts and crafts fair held each June in partnership with Westerville Community Bands; year-round Sip & Sketch art sessions at Meza Wine Shop 1st Tuesdays and 3rd Wednesdays; and WACKY Art Workshops for kids.

The quarterly themed Kids Krates offer 3-4 crafting opportunities to empower kids to learn, create, and craft at home. For this winter, the craft Krate includes supplies and instructions to create three kid-friendly crafts especially for ages 7-11. Along with the gourds, the Krate includes supplies for creating three snowflakes with beading and pipe cleaners, and painting up a pair of narwhals on canvas with acrylic paints.
