Demonstrations, workshops and presentations throughout the weekend will highlight the world of gourds and gourd art. Themed photo booths will be set up around the area throughout the Show. Gourd workshops are offered on Friday and Saturday (please see classes inside).

Free and open demonstration event will also take place Saturday and Sunday afternoon. Tables and chairs will be available for showing tools and techniques, for working on a favorite project and for conversation.

#### **Betty Finch**

Betty Finch was born in Indiana, had a career in, CA, and currently resides in Cleveland, TN.

Her father, Robert Shaneyfelt, was awarded a scholarship to Art School at age 11. Her mother, Margaret Virtue, was also an artist. Her father taught high school Art and mechanical drawing for 30 years. As one of their 9 children Betty claims to have inherited their artistic ability. She believes her brain was hard-wired from a young age to create using natural materials, as result of making her childhood toys from found materials.

Intrigued by what she learned in Biology class, Betty began experimenting with plant genetics as a school girl and continues to do so today. Some of her multi-year projects involve cross pollinating and manipulating gourds.

Betty was homeless for two years of her young adult life after fleeing from physical spousal abuse. During this time she put herself through college working nights as a waitress, attending classes during the day, napping in a sleeping bag under bridges, in park bathrooms and on campus, eventually graduating with honors from Bakersfield College.



Duplicating a self-portrait at a printing shop resulted in Betty being hired on-the-spot as a Commercial Artist where she worked for sever-

al years before beginning a 26 year career with the Kern County Sheriff's Department where her duties included patrol, Homicide Detective, Nine years as the CSI Unit supervisor, 12 years as a SWAT Hostage Negotiator, and 15 years as the department composite artist.

The FBI sponsored Betty to attend the National Academy in Quantico, VA to complete the Forensic Facial Imaging Course where she learned to recreate a human face from a skull. She now uses those facial reconstruction skills to create three dimensional faces on gourds.

Betty's interest in manipulating gourds prompted her to travel to Indiana to meet mentor and master gourd trainer, Jim Story. After retirement Betty traveled to Tianjin, China to learn from Mr. Zhang Cairi, renowned for growing perfect replicas of Chinese Emperor's gourds. This led to her co-authoring a book to preserve this unique art form.

Combining her experience with facial reconstruction and gourd art she began making gourd humans and animals, creating a collection that evolved into a traveling show.

In addition to gourd festivals Betty's traveling gourd exhibit has been featured at the International Heirloom Expo and the San Francisco Flower and Garden Show. She enjoys sharing information on gourd crafting and especially loves entertaining others with her gourd sculptures, costumes, and marionettes.
