

Spring Meeting Minutes

The Ohio Gourd Society met on April 20, 2024, for our annual Spring Meeting. The meeting took place at the United Methodist Church in Sunbury, Ohio. The meeting was called to order at 11:00 AM by President Vikkie Mustad.

All attendees gave a brief introduction of themselves. Those in attendance were Vikkie Mustad, Terri Rideout, Nelda Sisler-Buck, Laura Dalton, Sherri Love, John Martin, Nancy Travis, Steve Murray, Pat Badgero, John Sherron, Judy Litzenberg, and Nelson Litzenberg.

Officer's Reports

The Secretary's report was given by Nelson. A motion to accept the minutes was made by Nelda and seconded by Laura. The motion carried. The Treasurer's report was given by Judy. The checking account balance is \$12,471.21 as of 4-12-2024.

Terri reported on the membership of the society which currently has 124 members. There are 36 expired memberships.

Historian Steve Murray encouraged everyone to send him pictures or newspaper articles for the scrap books. His mailing address will be posted in the next Gourd Greetings.

Lunch was enjoyed by everyone.

There was no Directors Report.

Gourd Greetings Editor Vikkie shared some craft items that she made with broken gourd pieces and gourd paper. She asked for input for future editions of the paper.

Show Committee reports:

Staging of tables and chairs will be put in the buildings by the fairgrounds prior to the show. Nelson will communicate the need with the fair office.

A Volunteer coordinator is needed for the Fall Show. John asked for some help with registrations. Nelson will help with that.

Publicity- Nelda talked about the use of our Facebook page to share "events", such as the show. Contacting area Senior Centers, Rack cards, school district art classes, Pin-a-Map registry of visitors, and press releases were some of the things discussed.

Financial support- Nelson encouraged everyone who contacted a sponsor last year to follow up for renewal this year. He will send out the new, updated letter to the committee. It was suggested that we might include the sponsor's name on a T-shirt back as an additional incentive. Lead time and cost of this will need to be determined.

Souvenirs- Suzanne communicated via messenger, the following: She will need about \$750.00 for souvenirs and \$200.00 for guest demonstrators.

Nancy will coordinate the silent auction this year on Friday and Saturday. Judy volunteered to help her.

Competition- John summarized the class changes and he will send those to a committee of Linda Rose, Terri Rideout, and himself for finalizing. If agreed on it will reduce the class numbers to 109ish!

Judging has been revised by the American Gourd Society and John is working through that.

The awards at the Fall Show will be the same as in the past.

Entertainment- Make-and-Take is a very popular part of the show, Terri coordinates that and she will need gourds and pieces of gourds for this. Vikkie will coordinate the music and scavenger hunt at the show. A photo op with "Gourdman" was discussed.

Demonstrations will be relocated to the arts and crafts building due to the merchants building noise level and space limitations.

John reported that there are 11 different workshops being offered over two days of the show. There will not be any workshops on Sunday.

The society approved a \$100.00 donation to the Ohio State Fair for the awards in the gourd competition. Entries are due by June 21, 2024.

Judy volunteered to send sympathy cards when it is communicated to her of a deceased member.
