OGS Members Selling Table

Is this you?!

My problem isn't that I **BUY** too many gourd supplies, my problem is that I **SHOP** more than I **CREATE!!!**



If so, the Show committee has thought of a way to help you reduce your stash of unwanted gourd supplies - and earn a bit of cash at the same time! Clean out your stash and <u>sell</u> those unused or gently used supplies at your Annual Show!!

How will this work?

Regular vendor regulations have been waived for this special opportunity and is available for <u>current</u> OGS members only.

Members Selling Tables will be set up in the Main Vendor building at the Show where you can display for sale up to 10 items at a time across the 3 day Show. You set your price and pay 15% commission of your Gross Sales to the OGS.

- At least one Show Committee representative and one OGS member will oversee the Selling Tables so you will not have
 to be present across the entire Show; however, we ask that you volunteer for at least one 3 hour shift. If you cannot
 volunteer for at least one 3 hour shift, you can alternatively donate one additional item to the OGS Silent Auction.
- Items to be sold can include new or gently used supplies, books, instructional DVDs, embellishments, hand or power tools. Items must be in good working condition and clearly indicate if they've been used/opened. Gourds (crafted and uncrafted) can be sold (clearly indicate if the seller is not the artist).
- You may replace items up to a maximum of 10 items displayed at a time.
- Provide your own stickers/label with your selling ID*, Item # and price; an inventory sheet (attached) will be provided to keep track of your items.
- Arrange to drop off items for sale and to pick-up unsold items at the conclusion of the Show.
- We are still working on how to handle credit card sales, fees, etc., so, tbd,
- Your money (*Gross sales minus commission and any credit card fees, tbd*) will be distributed at the conclusion of the Show when you pick up your unsold items.
